Gluttony Doesn't Pay

The northern pike I entered in the YFC fishing contest was far from a winner, but it is one of the best fish stories of the year.

I went bluegill fishing in Lake Monona about the middle of July. I was armed with typical panfish rigs - ultralight spinning gear, fourpound line, small jig, and some Big Red worms. I usually drift unless or until I find a good spot to anchor. I started drifting off the mouth of the Yahara River. I marked some fish, so I baited up and dropped one line in the water. Almost immediately, I caught a fish. I thought this could be a banner day. I baited up again and dropped the first line back in the water, then baited up a second rig and dropped it in. About that time, I had a bite on the first pole. As I was landing that fish I had a bite on the second pole. I set down the first pole with the fish and set the hook on the second pole. I set the second pole down and finished landing the fish on the first pole. When I went to land the fish on the second pole, it was coming in hard. I thought probably I drifted into some weeds and the fish got tangled. Then the line started going the wrong direction. Usually, I set the drag tight on my panfish poles. I don't worry much about panfish breaking the line and sometimes I get a better hook set. With some back cranking at the appropriate time. I got the fish close to the boat where I could see it was the northern I entered in the fishing

contest. Fishing for panfish I wasn't prepared for landing the northern. I had to untie my landing

net one-handed while holding the rod in the other hand. One-handed, I couldn't back-crank the reel, and running the landing net onehanded on a bigger fish wasn't my preferred method, but I got the fish in the boat. I estimate it weighed about nine pounds. I could see it had something in its stomach, and I couldn't find my jig to unhook it. Finally, the line broke and I was going to release it. After working about 15 minutes, it was obvious the fish wasn't going to make it, so I added it to my bag. When I got home and cleaned it, it had a seven-inch bluegill in its stomach. The bluegill had my jig in its mouth. I hadn't hooked the northern, but it couldn't get the bluegill out of its stomach gluttony doesn't pay. I must have hooked the bluegill, and when I was landing the fish on my other pole, I suppose it took a minute or two; the northern swallowed the bluegill on my second pole. The bluegill was fine, and I cleaned it with the rest of the fish I got that day. I like northern to eat, but I am picking this one.

Stan's Pickling Recipe

Here is my pickling recipe (from Pat Patterson, an old-time, Vilas County fishing guide):

-For one-gallon of pickled fish - any whitefleshed fish works, not good for oily fish. It is good to freeze the fish, especially northerns for a few days before pickling to kill any tape worms. (I fill a 5-quart ice-cream pail with fillets or fish chunks)

-Fill a gallon jar half full of cold water and dissolve one-cup of pickling salt in it (I split the fish between two ice cream pails and use the above recipe for each pail)

-Put fish strips or chunk in salt solution and refrigerate for 48 hours.

-At the end of 48 hours, drain and rinse fish and container.

-Return fish to container and add cold white vinegar. Shake to loosen fish fillets or chunks. Refrigerate for 24 hours.

- About four hours before the of the vinegar period, make up the final brine. The final brine is one small box of mixed pickling spices, three cups of white sugar, and six cups of white vinegar. Bring the mixture to a rolling boil. Stir and boil the mixture for ten minutes and don't breathe heavily unless you have clogged sinuses. Set the mixture aside to thoroughly cool. (I triple the recipe except for the pickling spice for the amount of fish I pickle). After the mixture is cool you can add a couple cups of cheap wine.

-Slice a quantity of onions. Drain off and discard the white vinegar.

-Put fish in a separate container with a layer of fish and a layer of onions until the container is full. I use quart yogurt containers. When the container is full, pour in cold pickling solution. This fills about 11-12 yogurt containers. Refrigerate for two to three days, and the fish are ready for snacking. The longer you wait, the better the taste. If you have any pickling solution left, hard boil some eggs and pickle them.

Club Outings

The hard water season is finally here!

With cold weather forecasted all week now we should have stable ice locally at least in the shallows. Let's try to hit Monona Bay this weekend or early next week!

Mississippi Backwaters

Early ice Mississippi backwaters fishing has been producing some great fishing for perch, bluegills and crappies. The shallow areas around La Crosse and Stoddard have up to 8 inches of ice and with this cold week should be locked in good. I recently attended an excellent seminar by guide Adam Christianson at the WI Ice Fishing Expo and definitely know where to send you. I went on a scouting mission the next day and easily caught my limit of perch. Please contact me for information anytime and I would be happy to share what I learned. We will plan an outing to La Crosse over the next 2-3 weeks with January 11, 12 or 18, 19 all possibilities but again if you want to head up earlier or during the week let me know.

Devil's Lake trout fishing

Let's head up to Devil's Lake to fish for some trout through the ice. We're looking at the end of January for this one.

Green Bay Do Your Own Whitefish Outings (likely now January 11 or 12th)

I plan on going up to Green Bay and fishing every weekend available with safe ice. Come along and learn how we catch them in 5-20 feet of water. You would need to be able to walk a few hundred yards on ice but bring your ATV/UTV/Snowmobile if you have one.


2025 Brings More Mini Sessions


